



Millie, a student reporter, teams up with a cute boy to uncover who killed the high school's head football coach. Her dad is one of the key suspects.


Dead girls don't write letters by *Gail Giles*
Sunny is shocked when a mysterious girl shows up on her doorstep claiming to be her sister Jazz, who died in a fire several months earlier.




Death cloud by *Andrew Lane*

Fake ID by *L.R. Giles*
Nick is relocated to a new town while in the Witness Protection Program. He tries to solve a murder mystery when his first new friend shows up dead.



Freaks like us by *Susan Vaught*
A teen who suffers from schizophrenia gets involved in the search when his best friend disappears, and he is considered a suspect.




The girl who was supposed to die by *April Henry*
A teenage girl wakes up in a cabin in the woods with no idea who she is and with two men who want to kill her.



I was here by *Gayle Forman*
When her best friend commits suicide, Cody retraces her friend's steps to try to figure out what happened. Along the way, she finds more questions than answers.



Ink and ashes by *Valynne E. Maetani*
Sixteen-year-old Claire Takata discovers an old letter in her deceased father's journal, and starts on a path to discover the truth about her family's Japanese heritage and father's past involvement with the yakuza.



Miss Peregrine's Home for Peculiar Children by *Ransom Riggs*
This creepy novel uses vintage photography to help tell the story of fifteen-year-old Jacob who explores an abandoned orphanage off the coast of Wales and learns about the strange children who lived there. (also a graphic novel)

The name of the star (Shades of London #1) by *Maureen Johnson*
Seventeen-year-old Rory leaves her home in Louisiana to go to a boarding school in London. There she finds a murderer is recreating murders of Jack the Ripper.



Paper Towns by *John Green*
When his next door neighbor, Margo, vanishes just before their high school graduation, Quentin follows clues to try to find her.

The naturals by *Jennifer Barnes*
This book is a great choice for CSI fans. Cassie is recruited by the FBI to join the Naturals, a team of teens who have special abilities that help them solve crimes.



Ruby in the smoke by *Philip Pullman*
When her father dies at sea, sixteen-year-old Sally learns that she should inherit a missing ruby. Her search to find the precious jewel leads to danger and adventure.

Shelter: a Mickey Bolitar novel by *Harlan Coben*
When tragedy strikes his life, Mickey Bolitar moves to live with his uncle Myron and attend a new high school. There, he investigates the disappearance of his new girlfriend, Ashely. (first in a series)



Vanishing girls by *Lauren Oliver*
Sisters Nick and Dara were very close until a terrible car accident, tears them apart and leaves Dara with horrible scars. Dara disappears around the same time as another younger girl from their town, and Nick thinks the two disappearances might be connected.

We were liars by *E. Lockhart*
Cadence and her family live on a private island off Cape Cod. When she is fifteen, an accident leaves her with amnesia, and she tries to piece together what happened.



What happened to Cass McBride? a novel by *Gail Giles*
Kyle believes popular girl Cass McBride is responsible for his brother's suicide, so he kidnaps her and buries her alive. Told in alternating viewpoints, the story unravels. A scary, page turner.

The astrologer's daughter by *Rebecca Lim*
Avicenna Crowe's mother is an astrologer with a history of being stalked. Now she is missing. Avicenna begins to piece together the mystery, but is led deep into the city's dark and seedy underbelly, unaware of how much danger she is in.
