
Chapter Books for Young Readers

Butterfly buddies by Judy Cox


When a new girl, Zoey, joins her class in the middle of third grade, Robin hopes to become friends with Zoey as they work on a butterfly project together.

Hooey Higgins and the shark by Steve Voake


Hooey and his best friend, Twig, concoct a plan to capture a shark and charge people to view it so they can earn enough money to buy a giant chocolate egg.
