All-American Girl by Meg Cabot



My Most Excellent Year: A Novel of Love, Mary Poppins, and Fenway Park by Steve Kluger


Three friends tell about their high school happenings including their love interests when they are given a writing assignment for their eleventh grade English class.

Son of the Mob by Gordon Korman


Seventeen-year-old Vince, son of a Mafia boss, wants to date the daughter of an FBI agent, which leads to all sorts of comic mishaps.
