## The Grave of Anson Burlingame.

A chaste and neatly-chiseled sarcophagus has been placed upon the lot in Mount Auburn Cemetery, Cambridge, Mass., where lies buried the body of Anson Burlingame. It consists of a massive granite plinth succeeded by a marble buse, which bears a second base nearly molded and beaded: the latter is surmounted with a die deeply paneled for inscriptions and ornaments. The front panel is of Gothic shape. The cap which succeeds is embellished with sprays of olive foliage and fruit, and also with a beautiful cluster of palm-leaves. Front inscription, in old English letters. "Anson Bur-LINGAME." Rear. "Born Nov. 14, 1820. Died Fub. 23, 1870."
